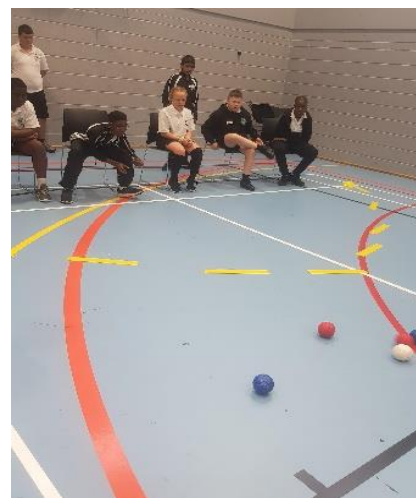
Primary Panathlon
