Primary PE and Sports Premium to continue

On 25th June, the Department for Education confirmed that the Primary PE and sports premium funding will continue for academic year 2022-23. The funding is a ring-fenced grant for English primary schools to provide additional and sustainable improvements for the quality of PE, sport and physical activity.

Spotlight on Swimming – Using the Primary PE & Sport Premium to Tackle Inequalities in Swimming

Having listening to their members and the wider workforce, afPE claim some schools, post the Covid lockdowns, are struggling to utilise their **Primary PE and sport premium** underspends.



In addition, for a number of reasons, schools are finding it difficult to meet their swimming commitments and targets. Therefore, as a collaborative project, the <u>Association for Physical</u> <u>Education</u>, <u>Youth Sport Trust</u> and <u>Active Partnerships</u> have created a <u>free resource</u> as part of our Primary PE and sport premium commitment. This will support the workforce and encourage schools to spend some of their funding on improving swimming attainment, through additional interventions.

Sunrisers, in partnership with Middlesex Cricket, are delighted to launch their new Junior Sunnies Fun Zone.

It is a teacher-delivered resource for the whole class. LEANS is guided by three big goals: know-think-do. The aim is for participating pupils and staff to...

- KNOW: Increase their knowledge of neurodiversity terms and concepts.
- THINK: Develop more positive attitudes towards neurodiversity and neurodivergence.
- DO: Increase individuals' positive and inclusive actions within the school community.
