The School Games Mark aims to reward and recognise schools engagement in the School Games and to celebrate the opportunities you provide to keep your students active.

You will be awarded either bronze, silver or gold based upon answers meeting specific criteria. Platinum is also available for those schools who have achieved four gold awards consecutively.



ULEZ ZONE

Many not-for-profit organisations that operate minibuses used for community transport can register for a temporary 100% discount of the ULEZ charge until 26 October 2025.

Once you have registered your vehicle and your eligibility has been confirmed, you will not be charged the ULEZ charge until after the end date of the grace period on 26 October 2025. After this date, all minibuses will need to meet the ULEZ emissions standard or pay the daily ULEZ charge. To apply click <u>HERE</u>
