# **Boccia "Come Try It!" Festival**

28 Teams from Infant, Primary and Secondary schools, joined us at Burnt Oak LC, to learn how to play the game of boccia, guided by the leaders from St James Catholic High School. Each school was allowed time to practice alongside their teachers, before playing some non scoring matches. Everyone went home (teachers included!) knowing a new sport and even a few tactics, ready for the competition later in the year.





#### **Panathlon Xtend**

Secondary Teams took part in the Panathlon Xtend at Copthall Leisure Centre, delivered in partnership with Panathlon Challenge, a special needs sports charity. Where a variety of pupils with needs (e.g VI, HI, MLD, SLD) took part in a series of adapted sport stations, gaining points for their teams. At the end of the event all pupils took home medals, certificates and huge smiles.

They took part in adapted stations of tennis, tabletop cricket, boccia, basketball, bowling, football, target throwing and new age kurling, supported by the very attentive Compton leaders.

#### New E-Learning: An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia

<u>An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia</u> is a 30-minute e-learning workshop. Playing boccia improves lives! Learn more about this Paralympic sport and how you can play, coach and support it in your local community on this online course, endorsed by CIMSPA.

Everybody should have the opportunity to play sport and boccia is a totally inclusive sport which can be played by anyone. This online course will introduce you to boccia and highlight how you can play at your school, sports club, care home or community setting. You'll learn how boccia can improve lives and make a difference to people from a range of backgrounds. As 'An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia' is your first step towards getting involved in boccia and has been endorsed by CIMSPA and awarded 0.5 points.

Created in partnership with UK Coaching, this course will help you to:

- Know more about the sport of boccia
- Identify where and how to play boccia safely
- Try the sport from your own home
- Recognise who might play boccia and understand their motivations for participating
- Gain insight into boccia equipment and know how to adapt this to your setting.

The course is suitable for anyone interested in or currently coaching boccia, sports coaches, teachers, students, carers, activity coordinators, or volunteers.

Comprised of three modules, this e-learning should take around 30 minutes to complete and £10 will be payable to UK Coaching via the above link.
