BPSS UPDATES

PE & SPORT PREMIUM

On the 8th March 2023 the Government announced a <u>2 year extension</u> to the PE and Sport Premium funding and the announcement that schools will be required to deliver a minimum of 2 hours PE per week.

Maintained schools, including those that convert to academies, MUST publish, on their website, information about their effective and sustainable use of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding. The reporting deadline for this current academic year is 31st July, but we strongly recommend that you update it regularly.

Schools must publish the amount of Primary PE and Sport Premium received for this year 2022-23; a full breakdown of how it has been spent (or will be spent); what impact the school has seen on pupils' Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity, participation and attainment and how the improvements will be sustainable in the future.

Head Teachers, Subject Leaders and Governors will be able to use this simple reporting mechanism to ensure they are grant compliant in demonstrating effective use of the grant to achieve a sustainable impact.

KS1 & KS2 SCHOOL GAMES MARK

The 2022/23 KS1 and KS2 School Games Mark applications are open until 26th July 2023.

The School Games Mark aims to reward and recognise schools engagement in the School Games and to celebrate the opportunities you provide to keep your students active.

You will be awarded either bronze, silver or gold based upon answers meeting specific criteria. Platinum is also available for those schools who have achieved four gold awards consecutively.

If you would like to apply for this year's KS₂ School Games Mark, you will be required to login into the School Games Website <u>HERE</u>. You'll be required to complete the Inclusive Health Check prior to beginning the application, this can be found on your dashboard once you have logged in.

New E-Learning: An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia

<u>An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia</u> is a 30-minute e-learning workshop. Playing boccia improves lives! Learn more about this Paralympic sport and how you can play, coach and support it in your local community on this online course, endorsed by CIMSPA.

Everybody should have the opportunity to play sport and boccia is a totally inclusive sport which can be played by anyone. This online course will introduce you to boccia and highlight how you can play at your school, sports club, care home or community setting. You'll learn how boccia can improve lives and make a difference to people from a range of backgrounds. As 'An Introduction to the Sport of Boccia' is your first step towards getting involved in boccia and has been endorsed by CIMSPA and awarded 0.5 points.

Created in partnership with UK Coaching, this course will help you to:

- Know more about the sport of boccia
- Identify where and how to play boccia safely
- Try the sport from your own home
- Recognise who might play boccia and understand their motivations for participating
- Gain insight into boccia equipment and know how to adapt this to your setting.

The course is suitable for anyone interested in or currently coaching boccia, sports coaches, teachers, students, carers, activity coordinators, or volunteers.

Comprised of three modules, this e-learning should take around 30 minutes to complete and £10 will be payable to UK Coaching via the above link.
